

## **The Ricker Racker Club**

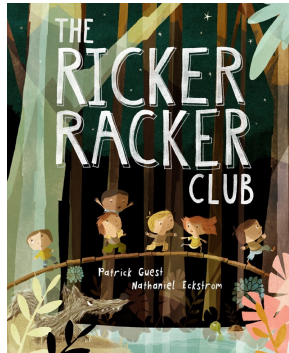

### **Discussion Points:**

- When you first looked at the cover, what did you think the story might be about?
- What is a 'club'? Can you name 10 different ones that you know?
- Have you ever made up your own club? If so, what was it called and what rules did you have in place?
- Why do clubs have 'rules'? Are they important for the running of a club? Explain.
- Can you think of some rules in everyday life? Why do you think the rules are in place?
- The Ricker Racker Club had its own rules. Can you remember what they were?
- Do you think they were all fair? If not, which ones do you think were unfair and why?
- What characteristics did Poppy show?
- Do you think that she was kinder and braver than the boys throughout the story? Explain.
- Can you recall all the things that the boys did? Were these acts of bravery, kindness or both?
- Could you ever imagine doing any of these things adventurous things that the boys did?
- Why did the boys attitude to Poppy change? How did they show their appreciation to her?

### **Activities:**

- As a class, make up your own 'club'. Think up a name and a theme for your club, what you want your club to achieve, activities that you plan on doing, make up a club dance and secret handshake and compile a set of 'fair' rules. Display your list of rules in the classroom.
- As a class, compile a list of things that show bravery and a list of ways that you can be kind to others. Think of as many different scenarios as possible.
